VIP ASSIGNMENTS

PATROL GROUP

As a Patrol VIP, you will work at least 16 hours per month to complement the field work of YCSO Deputies. Patrol VIPs are required to graduate from a specially-designed Volunteer Academy, be physically fit and successfully complete the AZPOST agency firearms certification training. Upon graduation, Patrol VIPs perform:

SPECIAL SERVICES GROUP

As an Administrative VIP, you will work at least 12 hours per month and perform some of the following duties:

- > Perform important Agency functions
- > Cold case investigations
- > Criminal Investigation Division assistance
- > Fingerprinting
- > Substation assistance
- > Other assigned duties



REQUIREMENTS

The Volunteer in Protection Program is open to anyone who is 21 years of age or older, is a United States citizen and has a desire to serve the community.

The candidate must possess an Arizona driver's license and be a resident of Yavapai County.

A successful background investigation and interview is a prerequisite to the VIP Program.
